New Zealander receives an Exceptional Award

Last Friday, the Chairman of the New Zealand branch of the Australasian Hydrographic Society, Kevin Smith conferred the award, Membership Emeritus on Larry Robbins, OBE, the Chief Executive Officer of the New Zealand Maritime Museum. The ceremony was held at the Museum.

Australasian Membership Emeritus is the Hydrographic Society's highest award. Larry Robbins is the first New Zealander to receive it. In congratulating Larry, Kevin Smith said "this is a great honour for both Larry and New Zealand. This award is rarely conferred. It is granted for the most significant and prolonged service to the Society, and for the promotion of Hydrography and related This award deservedly acknowledges sciences. Larry's work across Australasia and the International community".

Mr. Robbins served for 26 years in the Hydrographic Surveying Service of the Royal New Zealand Navy before joining the New Zealand National Maritime Museum in 2000. Mr. Robbins rose to command the Navy's survey ship HMNZS MONOWAI and at his retirement was Hydrographer of the RNZN. He was instrumental in establishing the Hydrographic Society and has represented the Society internationally.

At the award ceremony he said "that to receive such recognition from one's peers and former colleagues is humbling in the extreme".


