The Treasurer's Report of 31 December 2004 to 22nd November 2005 was reviewed.

3) Correspondence: (F. Oliff/ R. Cameron)

The joint ACLS and CHA publication "Canada's Offshore, Rights, Jurisdiction, and Management" is close to publication. Final figures have been received as well as the Forward from Mr. Shawn Murphy, M.P. for the PEI riding of Hillsborough.

4) CHA National President Address

Andrew Leyzack provided an update of activities: The CIG Council held an autumn meeting with the CIG Hydrography Committee.

Andrew said that the ACLS/CHA book "Canada's Offshore, Rights Jurisdiction, and Management" is to be published in time for the spring sitting of the ACLS Exams.

Members of the ACLS/CHA Task Force on the Certification of Hydrographers participated at an ACLS conference/meeting last summer and presented a paper on certification. There was an opportunity to meet with the presidents of the provincial survey associations to discuss their "expanded profession" programs.

There has been a request by the Australasian, Spatial Sciences Institute to the IHO for an endorsement of their accreditation program. The IHO are looking at a policy to endorse certification programs.

The Task Force is seeking an audience with the CHS Data Acquisition and Analysis Committee (DAAC) to clarify its aims and objectives. In particular, the Task Force sees certification as a part of a Career Development Plan for individuals pursuing Hydrographer In Charge positions in CHS.

The certification initiative recognizes and affirms the role of hydrography within the surveying and mapping community.

5) Committee Reports

Admiralty Launch Surveyor: (B. Power) Surveyor has been put up for the winter.

Lighthouse: (J. Weedon) The Spring edition was cancelled but the fall edition is underway and is currently at layout stage. It should be published in January.

Andrew is trying to get the CHA Directors together for a meeting on key issues, including Lighthouse. The direction of the journal hinges in part on our joining the International Federation of Hydrographic Surveyors (IFHS) and a meeting regarding IFHS is scheduled next week with all directors. One concern

is how to deal with the proposed new £15 fee which would result in a CHA dues increase. The U.S. is interested in establishing a North American Federation because they are concerned that the IFHS fee structure is too expensive.

6) Other Business:

Nominations and Ballots for Central Branches Executive have been slow; however George McFarlane has volunteered to act as Treasurer.

An appeal was made for new members and requests for help with *Lighthouse*.

Fred thanked Tim for producing the NewsLetter and the guests for attending the AGM, including Stéphane Thériault of CARIS.
