Treasurer's Report

Branch The Branch maintains *one* account at

the TD Canada Trust - Burlington

Account: Main Branch, located at 510 Brant

Street, Burlington.

It is a "Community A" account (an old type of account no longer offered by the Bank, but "grandfathered"). Whereas there will be administrative changes to bank procedures in May 2006, as of now, we are not subject to service charges so long as we maintain *a minimum* of \$10,000.00 in the account.

Our February statement showed a *balance of \$32,359.72* which includes \$8,010.41 for the Lighthouse account and \$1,850.41 for the Admiralty Launch Surveyor account (the latter two sums, *unaudited* balances at December 31, 2005.

We earned the princely sum of \$0.82 interest. As a result, I shall be seeking the Executive's approval to transfer a portion of our balance to a

Money Market GIC, cashable after 30 days without penalty, currently earning 2.8%.

I am unaware of any outstanding cheques, however we do have indebtedness to National for 2006 Dues.

The change over of signatories for the Branch Account was completed on February 21, 2006.

Audit:

The Branch Accounts for years 2003, 2004 and 2005 were handed over to Life Member Sam Weller on February 21st to be audited. A "Work in Progress".

Admiralty Launch Surveyor: (B. Power) World Hydrography Day is the only event to date. Brian contacted the *Canada Marine Discovery Centre* in Hamilton, Ontario regarding an exhibit celebrating WHD. A week-long static display at the *Canada Marine Discovery Centre* involving *Surveyor* is planned. CHS has established committees within each Region to promote WHD and will also be displaying Hydrographic information at the exhibit. The exhibit is to be staffed by volunteers. *Surveyor's* condition has yet to be assessed.

Educational:

Meetings: (F. Oliff) The next meeting is scheduled for April 19. Glenn Butt and Eivind Mong of C-Map are the planned speakers. Ab Rogers has offered to host the meeting. A venue and speaker for the May 17 is not yet decided. A video of Derek Hatfield's solo voyage has been suggested as possible presentation material. The June meeting may focus on the renovation of the old Beach strip lighthouse located at the entrance to Hamilton Harbour.

Annual General Meeting: (F. Oliff) The AGM is scheduled for December 7, 2006. The venue has been confirmed and will once again be the Mimico Cruising Club. A speaker has not yet been arranged, however solo sailor Derek Hatfield was suggested as a possibility.

Membership: (B. Power) Mailed invoices has proven to be been more effective than emails, so invoices are to be mailed out to delinquent members. There are 39 paid-up members as of March 15. 
